

The Beadery[®] Faceted Friendship Bracelet

Here is a simple bracelet design to help you get started with the Friendship Braiding Board from The Beadery[®]. It only uses the basic overhand and square knots, so you can get comfortable before moving up to more difficult knots and designs.

Materials needed:

- 13 6 mm round beads
- 26 4 mm faceted beads


90" (1.4 m) MagicLaceTM Friendship Cord

Other items and tools needed:

Friendship Braiding Board from The Beadery®, Scissors

Instructions:

Step 1: Cut the MagicLace[™] Friendship Cord into a 54" (1.4 m) piece and a 36" (91.4 cm) piece.




Step 2: Center the shorter piece of cord on the longer and fold in half.






Step 3: Tie an overhand knot in the cords to create a loop. The loop will be used for the bracelet closure, so it should be big enough for the 6mm round bead to fit through, but not too big.




Step 4: Attach the loop to the cord holding tab near the suction cups. Separate the long cords off to the sides and run the short cords down the middle.






Step 5: String all 13 of the 6 mm round beads to both ends of the shorter cord and secure the ends in the cord holding notches at the bottom.




Step 6: Using the longer cords, make two square knots near the loop and overhand knot.



Step 7: String one 4 mm faceted bead onto each of the longer cords and slide up to the knotted end.







Step 8: Using the longer cords, make one square knot to hold the faceted beads in place.

Step 9: Slide one of the 6 mm round beads up to the knots.









Step 10: Using the longer cords, make one more square knot to hold the round bead in place.

Step 11: Build the bracelet by repeating *Steps* 7 - 10 until you have used all of the faceted beads. There should be one more round bead left on the short cords at this point.

Step 12: Tie three square knots in the long cords after the last pair of faceted beads.



Step 13: Thread both long cords through the last 6 mm round bead.





Step 14: Using all four cords, tie another overhand knot making sure it is snug to the last bead.



Step 15: Trim off excess cord.
