

## The Beadery® Pop Tab Bracelet

Here is a simple set of instructions to get you started using plastic Pop Tabs from The Beadery® to make a colorful stretch bracelet. The Pop Tab colors used in these instructions are all from our hot multi (7623V077), which you can purchase at your favorite craft store.

## **Materials needed:**

4	Beadery Pop Tabs	Pink
4	Beadery Pop Tabs	Orange
3	Beadery Pop Tabs	Yellow
4	Beadery Pop Tabs	Green
4	Beadery Pop Tabs	Blue
3	Beadery Pop Tabs	Purple
1 yd (91 cm)	Elastic Cord	Silver




## Other items and tools needed:


Ruler, Scissors, Craft Glue

## **Instructions:**


**Step 1:** Fold the 1 yd (91 cm) cord in half and slide one end through each of the holes in a green tab. Make sure the tab is centered on the cord.



Step 2: Place a pink tab half way on top of the green tab and run one end of the cord down through the pink and green tabs. Repeat with the other cord end through the other holes.




*Step 3:* Place a blue tab between the pink tab and the cord. Run one end of the cord up through the blue and pink tabs. Repeat for the other cord end.







Step 4: Place an orange tab between the cord and the blue tab and slide it up next to the pink tab. Run the cord ends down through the holes in the orange and blue tabs.




*Step 5:* Place a purple tab between the orange tab and the cord. Slide it up next to the blue tab and run the cord ends up through the purple and orange tabs.




*Step 6:* Place a yellow tab over the purple tab and slide it next to the orange tab. Run the cord ends down through the holes in the yellow and purple tabs.



Step 7: Continue adding tabs in the color pattern illustrated until you have a string of 22 tabs.



**Step 8:** Bring the ends of the bracelet together and run the cord up through the holes in the first green and last orange tabs.




**Step 9:** Slide the first green tab under the last orange tab and run the cord ends down through the holes in the pink and green tabs.





*Step 10:* Turn the bracelet inside out and tie a double knot.



Step 11: Cut off the excess cord and place a drop of craft glue on the knot to secure it. Allow the glue to dry before turning the bracelet right side out again.
